Cadets Rise: A New Chapter in Discipline and Duty Begins



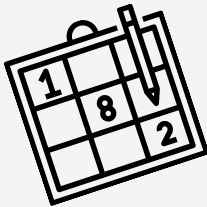

Fruity Fiesta: A Colourful Celebration at Sprouts

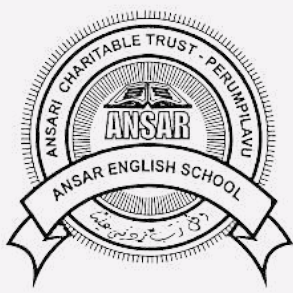

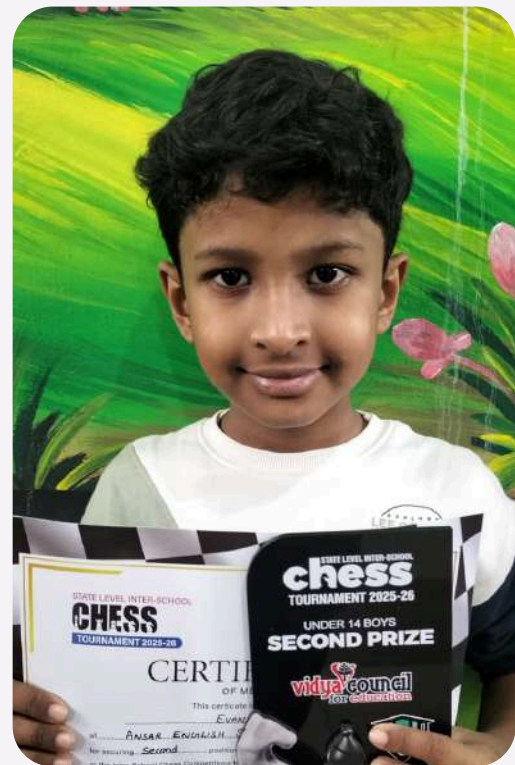


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Students Win Medals at IECI State Level Inter School Chess Tournament 2025
